

REGULATIONS KONINKLIJKE-HOLLAND BEKER 2023

Saturday 24 and Sunday 25 June 2023 Bosbaan Amsterdam

The races are governed by the WORLD ROWING Rules of Racing.

Entries and Time Table

Dutch crews are obliged to use the "KNRB Inschrijfprogramma (FOYS)" to register their crews. Registration closes on June 17, 2022.

The entry procedure for Non-Dutch depends on the number of crews;

- For 1 crew, complete <u>this international entry form</u> and as attachment via e-mail to <u>regatta@hollandbeker.nl</u>.
- For 2 crews or more, reach out to us via <u>regatta@hollandbeker.nl</u> and we will equip you with a login for the Dutch national registration system.

Based on the entries, a provisional time table will be published on Monday June 19. The definite times for all races will be assigned during these times: Friday, June 23 18:00 hrs for Saturday's races and at Saturday, June 24 18:00 hrs for Sunday's races. There will be no team managers meeting, but there is a moment to ask questions on Friday 23 at 18:00 hrs at the regatta course. Foreign contestants will be informed via e-mail on the details of this Q&A session.

Lane use and Fairness

The lanes are marked with red buoys (Albano system). During normal weather conditions crews will be started in the lanes according to the following schema:

In case of special circumstances, for instance during adverse weather conditions, it may be decided to use a different scheme for lane assignment.

The Regatta Management will continuously monitor weather conditions. Consequential impact on fairness is monitored by the fairness commission. On the occasion of predicted adverse weather condition, the president of the jury can decide to act in accordance with the possibilities of the Rules of Racing of WORLD ROWING (Rule 63 and its Bye-Law) to ensure safe and fair rowing conditions for all contestants. The fairness committee will advise the president of the jury prior to this decision.

Traffic Rules

Please take notice of the traffic rules during racing as well as during training. It is of great importance to follow these traffic rules.

Qualification system

Events W1x 'Ladies trophy' and M1x 'Holland Beker' qualify as WORLD ROWING CUPS. There shall be heats on Saturday Morning, Repechages or Quarter Finals on Saturday afternoon, Semi-finals on Sunday Morning and Finals (A, B,..) on Sunday afternoon.

All other events have finals in the afternoon and if required heats in the morning, see pages 48-49 of <u>this file</u> for the progression system – no B-finals except for event JM1x and JW1x, all finales will be . This is the default progression system used at Dutch regattas.

The medal ceremony will take place after each final of an event on the ceremony stage.



Para events

All Para Events will be raced over 2000m.

Depatures from WORLD ROWING rules

The Koninklijke– Holland Beker regatta has the following departure from FISA Rules of Racing or Bye-Laws:

- 1. Visible Boat Names are allowed and are not to be considered as 'Advertising Space'.
- 2. All rowers in a composite crew may wear the same uniform which is not necessarily their club uniform. The implementation must then be fully identical within the crew.
